Presentations

FFA National Trip Presentation

AHS FFA member Riley Sleichter was in attendance to visit with board members regarding the FFA National Convention trip to Indianapolis, Indiana earlier this year. Riley first thanked them for approving the out of state travel for this convention. According to Riley, fourteen members of the Abilene chapter were able to make the journey. Attendance is based on the number of points that members received the previous year. The most influential experiences of the trip for Riley were: the ability to connect with other chapters, team building for the Abilene chapter and attending two sessions while there. All fifty states and Puerto Rico were represented for an approximate attendance of 65,000. Board members had a few questions for Riley and thanked him for his excellent presentation.

Doin' It Right Spotlight

Denise summarized the Doin' It Right process and announced that the November Doin' It Right Spotlight goes to Debora Farr. Deb is the Family and Consumer Science teacher at the high school, has been with the district for 14 years and has supplied lots of food for different meetings and events. Denise said that anytime requests are made of Deb, the answer is always yes with a smile. A short video containing praises for Deb by AHS staff and students was shared. Board members thanked Deb and presented a certificate to her.

Kansas Association of School Boards (KASB)

Board members Barb Brittan, Mark Wilson and Gregg Noel were presented with certificates from the Kansas Association of School Boards (KASB). The certificates represent achieving the Honor Roll status for 2015-2016 KASB Leadership Academy Training Program.

Individual Plans of Study

Chris Cooper gave a presentation regarding Individual Plans of Study (IPS) for middle school and high school students. According to Chris, an IPS is not a one-time activity, but an ongoing process by which students define, explore and then refine their interests and goals. The IPS is digital and can be modified as students learn more about themselves. The Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE) is spurring this as they will begin tracking post-secondary education. Career Cruising is the program that the district has chosen to use for the IPS'. Cost of the program is \$2,400.00. Board members will hear more about this on Thursday November 17, 2016 at their scheduled goal setting retreat with KASB's Dr. Brian Jordan. Much discussion ensued.

Tour of the AHS Auditorium

Board members and meeting attendees boarded a district bus to tour the newly completed auditorium at the high school. According to AHS principal Ben Smith, training continues on the lighting portion of the auditorium. The seating area, stage and orchestra pit were toured. Next was the performance gym. Several of the state championship shingles have been installed.

Denise informed board members that no official RFPs were received for the Garfield building. There has been some local interest as well as some interest by a couple of companies. Denise requested that board members extend the time frame for the RFP until January 1, 2017. General consensus was to approve the request.

The list was summarized and board members were invited to add their ideas. Some questions and discussion followed. This list will be refined and presented at future meetings.
